Neg Amd 3 to Lease Agmt 73-37421 with Dock and Lift, Inc. for rental of HCRRA property in Spring Park, extending the contract through 08/31/23, adjusting rental rate (recv \$1,411 first year)

Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Director be authorized to negotiate Amendment 3 to Lease Agreement 73-37421 with Dock and Lift, Inc. for rental of approximately 2,000 square feet of Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority property located north of Shoreline Drive (CSAH 15) and west of Kings Road in Spring Park, extending the contract period through August 31, 2023, and adjusting the annual rent to \$1,411 per year for the first three years, with an adjustment in the fourth and fifth years; that following review and approval by the County Attorney's Office, the Chair be authorized to sign the Amendment on behalf of the Authority; and that the Controller be authorized to accept and disburse funds as directed.

Background:

History: Dock and Lift, Inc. owns a building at 4532 Shoreline Drive in Spring Park adjacent to Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority's (HCRRA) Dakota Rail corridor. Since 1991, a 20ftX100ft strip of the corridor has been leased by the owners of this building. The lease was assigned to HCRRA upon purchasing the corridor in 2001. Dock and Lift, Inc. purchased the building in 2002 and has continued the lease to store dock materials.


Consistent with HCRRA's *Land Use Management Plan*, Amendment 3 to Lease Agreement 73-37421 extends the lease term for a five-year period, through August 31, 2023, and adjusts the annual rental charge to \$1,411 with an adjustment after three years according to the Consumer Price Index. Dock and Lift, Inc. will make an additional annual payment equal to 30 percent of the rent in lieu of property taxes. Either party may terminate the lease by giving a 30-day written notice.

Current Request: Amendment 3 to Lease Agreement 73-37421 with Dock and Lift, Inc. will extend the existing agreement through August 31, 2023 and adjust the annual rent to \$1,411 for the first three years with adjustments in the fourth and fifth years.

Recommendation from County Administrator: Recommend Approval

Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Director be authorized to negotiate Amendment 4 to Cooperative Funding Agreement A166179 with Metropolitan Council (Council Document #16I055) for the METRO Green Line Extension Project ("HCRRA Southwest Corridor Match" capital project 1000899) Project Development Continuance and Engineering phases, extending the contract period through October 31, 2018, with a revised cash flow sheet, and no increase in the not to exceed amount of \$67,489,145; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if Hennepin County and Metropolitan Council staff do not agree on the timing of right-of-way acquisition activities, the project decision-making requirements approved by Resolution 18-HCRRA-0026 and incorporated into the Agreement through Exhibit E to Amendment 3 will apply; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that following review and approval by the County Attorney's Office, the Chair be authorized to sign the amendment on behalf of the Authority; and that the Controller be authorized to disburse funds as directed.

Background:

History: Resolution 16-HCRRA-0037 authorized Cooperative Funding Agreement A166179 with the Metropolitan Council for the provision of up to \$53,134,401 for Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority (HCRRA) Southwest Light Rail Transit (SWLRT) (CP 1003570) Project Development Continuance and Engineering Phases (PDC/ENG phases). Additionally, Agreement A166179 identifies up to \$45,884,127 of the not to exceed amount, to be reviewed and encumbered quarterly by the HCRRA, for pre-award authority and Letters of No Prejudice construction activities.

Resolution 17-HCRRA-0029 authorized Amendment 1 to Agreement A166179 extending the contract date from July 31, 2017 to March 31, 2018, and increasing the HCRRA's contract authority for the agreement by \$6,765,599, for a new total not to exceed amount of \$59,900,000.

Resolution 18-HCRRA-0012 authorized Amendment 2 to Agreement A166179 extending the contract date from March 31, 2018 to May 31, 2018, and increasing the HCRRA's contract authority by \$3,369,282 for a new not to exceed amount of \$63,269,282, and increasing the HCRRA's pre-award contract authority by \$5,073,637 for a new pre-award not to exceed amount of \$50,957,764.

Resolution 18-HCRRA-0026 authorized Amendment 3 extending the contract date from May 31, 2018 to August 31, 2018, and increased the HCRRA's contract authority by \$4,219,863 for a new total not to exceed amount of \$67,489,145. This amount included funds for HCRRA's share of the purchase of the Bass Lake Spur rail corridor from Canadian Pacific Railway, the closing on which will not move forward except subject to certain conditions, including a favorable decision at the federal Surface Transportation Board.

Amendment 4 will extend the contract date from August 31, 2018 to October 31, 2018, with no increase in the not to exceed amount. The amendment will also require the application of certain project decision-making requirements if Hennepin County and Metropolitan Council staff cannot reach agreement on the timing of the project's right-of-way acquisition activities.

Current Request: Amendment 4 to Cooperative Funding Agreement A166179 with the Metropolitan Council for the METRO Green Line Extension Project (CP 1000899) PDC/ENG phases, extending the contract term from August 31, 2018 to October 31, 2018, no increase in the contract amount.

Impact/Outcomes: Amendment 4 to Agreement A166179 will support ongoing engineering work for the METRO Green Line Extension Project in preparation for the Metropolitan Council's application for a full funding grant agreement.

Neg Amd to Agmt between Metropolitan Council and Ciresi Conlin for outside counsel services, authorizing HCRRA to become a party to the Agmt

Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board authorizes the Executive Director to negotiate an Amendment that adds the Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority (HCRRA) as a party to an existing Agreement between the Metropolitan Council and Ciresi Conlin, LLP for specialized legal services related to the Southwest light rail transit project that; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board authorizes the Executive Director to negotiate a Cooperative Funding Agreement between HCRRA and the Metropolitan Council whereby the costs of the Ciresi Conlin contract would be paid with project funds; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that following review and approval by the County Attorney's Office, the Chair be authorized to execute the Amendment and the Cooperative Funding Agreement; and that upon execution, the Executive Director be authorized to terminate Agreement A188850 between HCRRA and Ciresi Conlin LLP.

Background:

Agreement A188850 is with Ciresi Conlin LLP for specialized expertise related to litigation arising out of the Southwest Light Rail Transit project and filings with the federal Surface Transportation Board for which the Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority (HCRRA) and the Metropolitan Council were both parties with aligned interests. On May 22, 2018, HCRRA, through Resolution 18-HCRRA-0025, authorized Amendment 1, increasing the not to exceed amount from \$50,000 to \$500,000. The Metropolitan Council entered into a similar agreement with Ciresi Conlin for the same services. It was understood that HCRRA and the Metropolitan Council would divide the billings equally under their separate contracts.

Staff at HCRRA and Metropolitan Council have agreed that the costs on both contracts are properly considered to be project costs to be paid by the Metropolitan Council with project funds. Accordingly, HCRRA, the Metropolitan Council and Ciresi Conlin wish to place the services under a single, joint contract providing for payment from project funds, and terminate the HCRRA contract. This arrangement more properly reflects the funding structure without changing any of the representation rights. This will be accomplished through an amendment to the Metropolitan Council contract with Ciresi Conlin whereby HCRRA becomes a party to that contract. A separate funding agreement between HCRRA and the Metropolitan Council will provide that the Metropolitan Council will pay HCRRA's share of the representation with project funds.
