Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the contracts, contract amendments and administrative actions of the Human Services & Public Health Department and Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation made pursuant to Chapters 256E and 393 of Minnesota Statutes, as detailed in Human Services & Public Health Contract Report 1908 be approved; that the report be filed in Contract Management Services; that the Chair of the Board be authorized to sign the contracts, contract amendments and administrative actions on behalf of the County; and that the Controller be authorized to disburse funds as directed. Such contracts are subject to ministerial adjustment, when such adjustments are done within the constraints of the approved Hennepin County Budget and when signed by the County Department Director or Designee.

Background:

The contracted dollar amounts are based on estimates of program costs and/or utilization during prior periods. Funding for each contract is provided for within service categories in the Human Services & Public Health Department and Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation approved annual budgets. Occasionally new services are implemented which are not in the budget but which are fully funded under state or federal grants or other new funding.

Contracted dollar estimates are based upon prior year usage and are subject to fluctuation in placement patterns, service need, and cost shifts. Therefore, it may be necessary to process ministerial adjustments to contracts to increase or decrease contract amounts or to make minor service changes consistent with the department budget and strategic plan. Placement agreements are also processed administratively.

Contracts include services in the following areas: adult mental health; developmental disabilities; chemical health; adult housing; early intervention and family intervention services, day treatment services; emergency shelter; day care; training and employment services, interpreter services, health services, welfare advocacy, and various other human services. Expectations for ongoing outcome measurement are included in all new, renewal, or extended contracts. Outcome measures, which are developed by the county and contracted providers, assess the effectiveness of a service and its impact on an eligible recipient's condition or functioning level. Outcome information is used to modify or improve programs as well as to evaluate effectiveness of different types of intervention and providers. A detailed listing of the specific actions requested by this BAR and an explanation of all unusual items is reflected in the summary of the report.

Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, that Amendment 2 to Agreement A188719 with Minnesota Department of Human Services for the provision of adult mental health services, extending the contract end date through June 30, 2020 and increasing the receivable amount by \$216,769 to a new total receivable amount of \$867,074 be approved; that the Chair of the Board be authorized to sign the amendment on behalf of the County; and that the Controller be authorized to accept and disburse funds as directed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Human Services and Public Health Department be authorized to receive a supplemental appropriation of \$216,769 to the 2019 department budget; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that sponsorship and acceptance of grant funding for this program by the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners does not imply a continued funding commitment by Hennepin County for this program if grant funds become no longer available.

Background:

Agreement A188719 with the Minnesota Department of Human Services in the amount of \$650,305 was approved by the Board on March 27, 2018 (Resolution No. 18-0122). Amendment 1 adjusted the contract dates to run January 25, 2018 through October 31, 2019 with no change to the receivable amount. Amendment 2 will increase the approved budget by \$216,769 to a new total receivable amount of \$867,074 and extend the contract end date to June 30, 2020.

Funds will be used for integrated mental health services provided at the Behavioral Health Care Center at 1800 Chicago Avenue in Minneapolis. The target population includes a core group of 1,000 Hennepin County residents with serious mental illness and complex co-occurring conditions who cycle from detention to intensive psychiatric hospital services, to the street, and back. Hennepin County's goal is to divert this population into innovative, collaborative, and community-based mental health services. Hennepin County will contract with Hennepin County Medical Center (HCMC) to operate triage and urgent care services at 1800 Chicago Avenue, and with the Minnesota Community Healthcare Network (MCHN) to provide interim care coordination that links participants to ongoing community mental health supports.

The result is improved health and wellbeing: keeping people connected to services in the community in less restrictive, less costly settings. The Innovations grant funded the hiring of one part-time interim care coordinator and one advanced care practitioner who works at an acute care clinic at 1800 Chicago Avenue. Other funding supports additional staff working on the service team, including 1 peer recovery specialist and 2 additional interim care coordinators. The service team examines the clients' physical, mental health, and addiction issues, and make an interim case plan. Since September, 159 individuals have been referred for services, 72 have completed an initial service plan, and 29 have gone on to long-term services. Subcontractors include Mental Health Resources Inc. and Hennepin HealthCare Services.

Supp appr of \$167,355 to the 2019 HSPH budget, add 1 grant funded FTE for the provision of early intervention and prevention services for families

Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Human Services and Public Health Department be authorized to increase their staff complement by 1.0 FTE grant positions and receive a supplemental appropriation of \$167,355 to the 2019 Human Services and Public Health budget; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that sponsorship and acceptance of the grant funding for this program by the Board of Commissioners does not imply a continued funding commitment for this program when grant funds are no longer available.

Background:

The Parent Support Outreach Program (PSOP) is a voluntary child welfare program that focuses on early intervention and prevention for families that are at high risk of child abuse and neglect. The target population is families with at least one child under the age of 10 with two or more risk factors such as: poverty; domestic violence; alcohol and drug abuse; mental health concerns; history of child protection involvement; and, homelessness, with a primary focus on those families with children 0 to 5.

A PSOP case manager focuses on rapid engagement with families in order to assess their strengths and needs. Families identify their case plan goals and the PSOP worker helps to link families with long-term, community-based supports that will assist families after the PSOP case has closed. Examples of services that PSOP families receive include, but are not limited to: housing supports; parenting resources; mental and/or chemical health services; and, support with basic needs.

PSOP services are provided by both operated Hennepin County social worker staff and contracted agencies. The operated unit receives cases from child protection that do not meet the criteria for an investigative response, but still considered to be at high risk of abuse and neglect.

Currently there is a wait list to receive services. Additional staff will allow the program to serve more high risk families in a timely manner, thus reducing risk and improving child well-being.

PSOP's goals are:

- Early identification and intervention with families who are at risk of child abuse and neglect; specifically, families with a child age 0 to 5 years old as well as prenatal
- Decrease in risk and increase in child wellbeing for families served by the program
- Connecting families with community-based agencies that are able to meet the families' long-term needs
- An increase in the Strengths and Needs Assessment score at the conclusion of the case as compared to the opening of the case

These goals directly align with federally-mandated outcomes related to safety, permanency, and well-being for children that are measured through the Child and Family Service Review process.
